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Exciting Changes at Central High School

It has been an exciting start to the 2017-2018 school year. Central High School has a newly renovated library that has been updated to provide a college and professional business environment feel with spaces for study, collaboration, and instruction. The Phase One addition is complete and includes a renovated and enlarged chorus and band room, a Living Skills classroom, additional classroom space for driver education, health classes, and state of the art fitness facilities including a strength and conditioning center as well as a cardio center equipped with spin bikes, elliptical trainers, treadmills, and rowing machines.

The Phase Two addition is underway and will include 12 classrooms, two of which will house our new INCubator program and our Mobile Maker program. These unique classrooms will be part of our new Entrepreneurial and Small Business Certificate Program coming in 2018. The INCubator Program is designed to entice young entrepreneurs to develop (and hopefully to "cash in on") creative ideas and essential skills (adaptability, critical-thinking, collaboration, creativity, and problem solving). This course will help prepare students to deal with the complexity of the challenges facing the world today and lead to cooperative education or internship opportunities for our students. The Mobile Maker program is designed to reach the students who have an interest in the everchanging landscape of technology. Mobile Maker focuses on teaching students how to code their own apps on their own personal iOS devices through hands-on projects.


Exciting Changes at Central High School, Continued

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Students in this class learn a multitude of future-ready skills, including but not limited to, problem-solving, critical-thinking, collaboration, resourcefulness, and perseverance. The Phase Two addition will also provide for a Veterinary Tech Education classroom. This innovative classroom setting will be used for veterinary science with an end goal of students exiting the program with a veterinarian assistant certification.

The field house is also part of the Phase Two addition. The field house will include four full size basketball courts and an indoor 200-meter track, which will be used to host state qualifying indoor track meets. The primary use of the space will be for physical education classes, marching band use, extracurricular athletics, and athletic feeder programs.



On Sunday, September 10, 2017, the district hosted an open house for the community to tour the high school facility. Over 100 community members took part in the tours. The district is planning the Grand Opening of the Phase Two addition tied to the 2018 Burlington Days celebration. More information will be shared as we get closer to that date.
